


HOW TO GET TO DIANI

By Air

Flights run daily from Jomo Kenyatta International Airport to Ukunda (Diani Airport). There are also flights from Nairobi Wilson to Ukunda Airport.

The airlines which fly the route are:

Jambojet, Safarilink, Skyward Express, East African Air

By Rail

Take the SGR from Nairobi to Mombasa. You can then get a taxi or shuttle from the SGR terminus at Mombasa to Diani.

By Road

You can catch an overnight bus from Nairobi to Ukunda. This is a long trip taking around 12 hours but normally the most cost effective way to get to Diani.

Ocean Tribe can arrange taxis and transfers too.

It is also possible to get Ubers in Mombasa although the Uber map calculation might not take the ferry into account and calculate a longer route.

Internship Itinerary

Start - Arrival at the Coast

Pickup from Mombasa or Ukunda airport and transport to Diani to get you settled in at the dive intern accommodation and orientated to the dive school

Week 1- Orientation and OpenWater Course

Days 2 & 3 are spent acclimatising yourself and finding out about the local area around Diani. If you are being fitted out for dive your own equipment in Kenya this will happen on day 2. You will also run through your training schedule with the internship manager and also find time to study your PADI Open Water digital materials. On day 4 it is time to start diving with the PADI Open Water Diver course which will take place over 4 days.

Week 2- Begin to Get Advanced

PAD Advanced Open Water diver course (2 days) and just get out fun diving to get experience and build your dive count. Begin PADI Specialty diver courses to be completed by the end of your program (5 in total)

Week 3- Learn Your Rescue Skills

EFR and CPR training (1 day) followed by PADI Rescue Diver course course (3 days)and some more recreational dives and relaxation.

Week 4- Begin the Divemaster Training

Dive theory. Log more experience dives and practice your staged diving skills.

Week 5- Get More Specialised and Experienced

2 x PADI Specialty Diver Courses and logging experience dives

Week 6- Divemaster Course

Now we're getting responsible. Begin Your PADI Divemaster course and the entry level to professional diving.

Weeks 7-10 - Divemaster Trainee

Assist with leading divers and gaining experience, all the time logging more dives.

Weeks 8-12 - Divemaster Certification and Work Experience

Once you complete the Diverseter course its time for work experience with Ocean Tribe instructors.

Week 13-15 - PADI IDC

IDC Preparation course, EFR Instructor Course, PADI IDC and PADI Instructor Examination to become an PADI Diving Instructor.

Week 16- PADI Instructor Con-Ed

PADI Specialty Instructor Courses and PADI Team Teaching with another PADI Dive Instructor to introduce you to teaching a PADI dive course.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

How Much Do I Pay For My Flight to Kenya and Who Do I Fly With?

A Flight to Kenya from the UK or Europe should be around £500 GBP. This can vary depending on the time of year and how soon in advance you book it etc.

Either go directly to the airline's websites listed below or visit sites such as www.momondo.com.

The airport you need to fly to is Nairobi (NBO).

From Nairobi Jomo Kenyatta International Airport or Wilson Airport, you can get a short flight down to Ukunda Airport (UKU). The Ukunda Airport is located minutes from the dive centre.

Wilson Airport is located about 10km from JKIA and about a 15-minute taxi ride. You should pay attention to the connection times as in many cases an overnight stay in Nairobi might be required, depending on the arrival time of your

international flight.

Alternatively, some international carriers fly directly to Mombasa Airport (MBA) and you can travel from Mombasa Airport to Diani which is about 40km.

Ocean Tribe can also arrange your flight to Kenya for you and cover all logistics. Contact us for more details.

Do I need any Vaccinations to Travel to Kenya? What About Medications?

Regarding vaccinations to travel to Kenya, we recommend that you ask your doctor about this before coming.

Generally, Hepatitis, Typhoid, Polio and Tuberculosis shots are required. Yellow Fever inoculations are also required by many countries when arriving from Kenya so it is a good idea to have them.

You might want to consider taking anti-malarial tablets for the duration of your stay. It is a good idea to consult your doctor about this 4-8 weeks prior to coming to Kenya. If you take prescribed medication then bring enough with you. Make sure these are clearly labelled with a doctor's prescription/ Although it is fairly easy to get most medicines in Kenya, it will provide you with peace of mind with proven medicines.

Do I Need a Medical to Dive?

A medical to dive is required for all divers with any preexisting medical conditions, which might be contradictions to diving safely

When you arrive here before you start your training we will ask to fill out the Medical Statement either physically or via our online medical declaration. This will then be assessed to see if a doctor's approval is required for diving. For your diving professional programs, we require a medical form signed and stamped by a licensed doctor.

We recommend that you print off and get the medical to dive evaluation done and a couple of copies signed by your family doctor before coming to Kenya. The Medical Statement applies to every course and can be downloaded. Genuine medical statements, not copies have to be submitted to PADI for the IE and Instructor Application.

How Long Does My Dive Training Take? Why Is the Internship 7 Months From Beginner to Instructor?

How Long Does My Dive Training Take? Assuming that you will want some time away from diving and a day or two off a week then you need to allow yourself time to fit in all of your courses and get the dives that you need in. The guides provided from each starting level for each internship give a good indication of how much time you will need although in certain cases they can be done guicker.

The full Beginner to Instructor Internship lasts 7 months to allow you time to acclimatise when you arrive and complete your PADI Open Water Diver Course.

There must be a period of at least 6 months between the completion of your Open Water course and your PADI IDC/IE so this allows you to meet this requirement if you are starting from the beginning. During this time you complete the other programs and rack up a large number of dives.

Some of our interns leave will well over the required amount of 100 dives.

- 40 Logged Dives are required to start the PADI Divemaster Course
- 60 Logged Dives are required as part of the PADI Diverse Course certification.
- 100 Logged Dives are required to enter a PADI Instructor Exam

What is my PADI Instructor / Divernaster Qualification Worth after I finish the Program?

PADI diving qualifications are among the most widely recognized worldwide and can be used anywhere in the world.

PADI Instructor

The PADI Open Water Scuba Instructor (OWSI) rating is the first PADI Instructor level attained by dive professionals. During their training, instructor candidates review PADI Standards, procedures, philosophies and teaching methods, as well as hone their practical teaching ability, watermanship, and diving knowledge.

After successfully completing a PADI Instructor Examination (IE), OWSIs take responsibility for introducing people to scuba diving through various PADI programs and courses.

Teaching status PADI Open Water Scuba Instructors may conduct a range of PADI programs from Discover Scuba Diving up to Divemaster (except or specialties which require specific Specialty Instructor ratings.

PADI Divemaster

The divemaster rating is the first PADI Pro Membership level. PADI Divemasters supervise diving activities for certified divers, assist instructors with training student divers, and instruct skin diving and snorkelling.

This rating denotes an individual who has exemplary diving skills and role model behaviour, solid rescue skills, professional-level knowledge of dive theory, dive management and supervision abilities,

and competence as a certified assistant.

What is there to do when I'm not diving?

Wow where do we begin? There is so much to do in Kenya, starting from the famous safaris, which can be included as bolt!on or as part of your internships, to the famous games parks of Kenya. Obviously down here at the coast there are fabulous water sports, skydiving, kiteboarding & fishing as well as cinemas, shopping areas and restaurants. If it is an outdoor activity then it can probably be done in Kenya and you should also take the time to see the wonderful Swahili culture. dating back to the Omani occupation hundreds of years ago.

Do I Need Dive Insurance?

Dive insurance can be provided through most travel insurance packages. You should make sure you check how much you are covered for though. Items to be checked should be regarding to dive limits, type of diving and depth.

We recommend Divers Alert Network (DAN), who can provide dive insurance packages up to professional level and the top packages will cover you for non-diving related conditions.

For divers who are enrolled on our professional dive courses such as the PADI Divemaster Course and the PADI IDC, you can look at Professional Dive Insurance. This is a requirement to work in a number of countries following on from your dive training and to be an active PADI member. It is recommended for all dive professionals, no matter where they are working.

For both Sport and Professional dive insurance policies, non-diving activities and considerations can be covered.

It is a good idea to carry insurance in the unlikely event that anything were to happen to you, you are definitely covered.

What Are The Procedures for First Aid and Diving Accidents?

Procedures for First Aid and Diving Accidents are taken seriously at Ocean Tribe. All our dive staff are fully trained in First Aid and CPR. We have an emergency action plan enacted by all staff in the event of an emergency.

Boats all carry emergency oxygen cylinders and a well equipped first aid kit. They carry life jackets and rescue lines with a buoy. Tour leaders and dive professionals carry out extensive dive safety and roster procedures with boat cover available at all times.

The nearest recompression chamber for Ocean Tribe is just down the road in the Kenya Naval Yard in Mombasa.

As a general note, it is a

good idea to bring your own small first aid kit with you for dealing with minor scrapes and illnesses. Other good things to bring include mosquito repellent and antimalarial tablets (not Larium).

What is the banking system like for me to have access to my money?

Almost all the Kenyan banks now have ATMs at most branches. The most reliable machines for international withdrawals are acknowledged as being at the NCBA, Standard Chartered, Barclays Bank, who have a large network of ATM in most Kenyan towns and support Visa, MasterCard and Cirrus International networks.

If you need to get money sent from home then there are Western Union and Moneygram offices and it is always a good idea to have some international travellers checks in the event of an emergency.

Ocean Tribe recommends using Transferwise and World Remit to send money

to yourself into an MPESA account. Interns will be taken to get a Safaricom SIM card for their mobile phone on arrival and this can be set up with MPESA mobile money payments. These are accepted by all businesses and tradesmen in Kenya and is an easy way to not have to carry cash. It is also cheaper to send money from your home debit or credit card to the MPESA account via World Remit than it is to make an ATM withdrawal.

Is Kenya a good place to bring families?

With a number of the Ocean Tribe staff, being born and raised in Kenya we can definitely say yes to this. The Kenyan people are immensely friendly and it is a great environment to bring a family to. It is possible to find childcare here and there are also international schools and nurseries.

What is the local communication infrastructure (mobile phones, internet etc) like?

Kenya has a modern up to date communications network. When you get here we will take you to buy a local SIM card for your mobile, which can go into unlocked mobiles. You can buy mobile phones here fairly cheaply, if you do not want to bring your mobile from home. Those on International roaming can receive calls although this is more expensive and is not recommended as bills can skyrocket quickly.

There is Wifi in the dive centre and it is very easy to communicate with the outside world via WhatsApp, Skype, Facebook and other social networks. The pay as you go data roaming on your mobile accounts is relatively cheap and you can also purchase data SIM cards with unlimited data for watching movies, in your leisure time.

What are the local voltage and pin types?

Kenya's voltage is 220/240AC, 50 Hertz. The plugs in are generally of a three!pin type with two parallel flat pins and a ground pin, the same as is used in the UK. Bring a universal adapter to run any electrical items if necessary.

How can I build up my experience following my internship? Can I stay on for work experience?

We offer a variety of experience packages for new instructors following the successful completion of their Instructor Evaluation (IE) including Specialty Instructor, Master Scuba Diver Trainer, IDC Staff Instructor and Master Instructor.

We encourage you to take advantage of these programs and build up your experience as an instructor before going out and working as an instructor and also to get the opportunity to work with our really experienced instructors and learn from them to help make you a more confident instructor yourself.

What is the Cost of Living?

The average cost of living / month is around \$500 US (with your accommodation included). It all depends on how much you are out and about, what activities you are doing etc. You will be studying some of the time and diving a lot of the time but bear in mind what you want to do with the rest of the time and budget accordingly.

Food

Kenya has a wide range of different cuisines available including western food. While you will have to go to Mombasa to find the large chain fast food joints, you will be taken on a tour of the local area by Ocean Tribe interns and shown the best places to eat.

Clothes

You do not need to bring a big wardrobe to Kenya. Bear in mind what you will need. You will be in a dive environment most days or a beach resort the rest of the time. You might want a couple of things for going out but it can be better to

buy things here in Kenya. (And as a result not have to worry a lot about the excess baggage charges on flights). Clothes can be fairly cheap here with open!air markets selling shirts and tops from a few hundred shillings, and jeans for not much more. At the more up market department stores shirts and T's are 1000 shillings upwards. Any clothes you feel you can't do without then it is a good idea to bring them with you.

Drinks

A bottle of local beer (Tusker, Pilsner, Whitecap) will set you back about 200-300 shillings in a bar. Foreign beers (except) are more expensive and harder to find.. Spirits are usually 200 to 300 bob a glass (plus mixer).

Getting Around

Most of the interns use local transportation such as motorbike taxis, tuk tuks and matatus (local minibuses) for going short distances. For longer distances taxis can be arranged but these can be a little pricey if you are on a serious budget.

For getting around East
Africa there are options like
the train, the inter-city buses
that run or the low cost
airlines from Ukunda to
Nairobi. The national airline
Kenya Airways also
operates flights from the
coast to up-country.

What Entertainment and Nightlife is there in Diani?

Diani is one of the main tourist areas in Kenya, however still maintains a beach island feeling. There are a few discotheques in the area for dancing although the popular Funky Monkey, Tiki Bar, Salty Squid, and Nomads Beach bar are the main hangouts for divers and locals alike. There are also backpacker bars and loads of fabulous restaurants to choose from.

What should I do to keep myself safe?

When in Kenya you should avoid carrying anything valuable when you are out and about. Anything of serious value we can keep for you in a safe at the office such as passports, and you

should not carry too much cash on you at the risk of pick-pockets. The best course of action is simply to keep your wits about you, especially at night. But by and large Kenya is a fairly safe country by African standards. For more information see:
